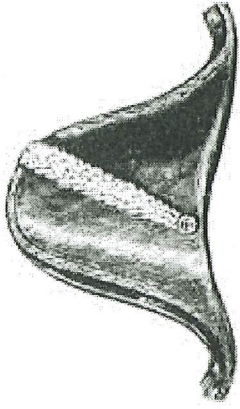
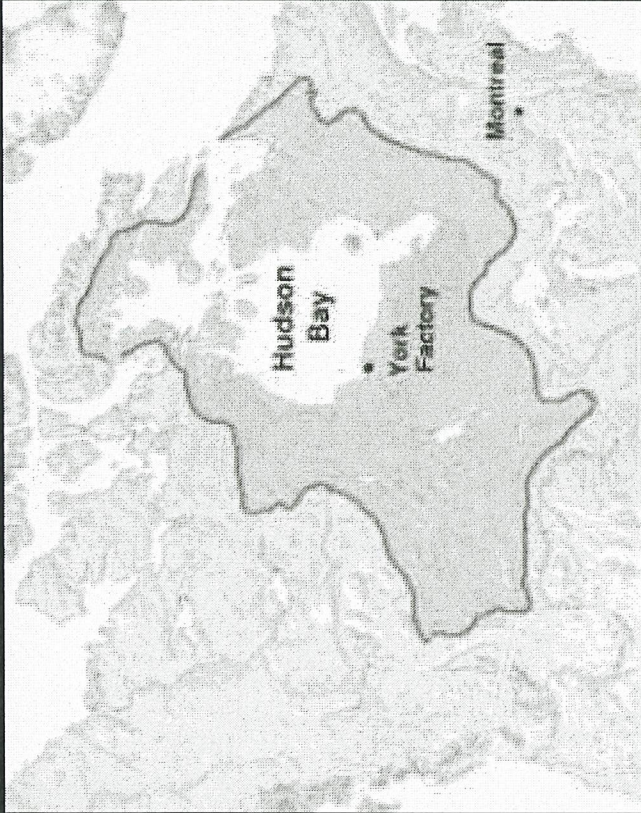
Timeline



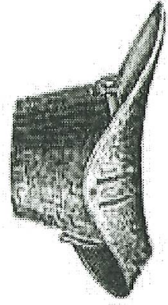
- 1670 HBC founded
- 1783 NWC founded
- 1810 Metis active in Red River area
- 1812 Selkirk Grant
- 1814 Pemmican Proclamation
- 1816 Battle of Seven Oaks
- 1821 HBC and NWC merge
- 1840 Metis fight for right to trade furs
- 1868 Canadians survey Red River area for new townships
- 1869 HBC land is sold to Canadian Gov't
- 1869 Metis revolt at Red River
- 1870 Manitoba enters Confederation

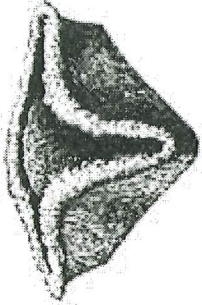

York Boat



- 12 metres long
- crew of 6-8 oarsmen
- payload of 3 tons (2700 kg)
- clinker-built out of large timbers
- used on the rivers between HBC forts and Hudson Bay
